ABOUT BATTLEFIELDS WEST ZONE

Battlefields West Zone stretches from north to south from South Waterloo through Brantford to Simcoe and includes a rich diversity in communities.

Brant Area serves the City of Brantford and the Brant County communities of Burford, Oakland/Scotland, Paris and St. George. Visit the Brant website at <http://www.battlefieldsbrant.50megs.com>.

Lynn Valley Area is located in the heart of Norfolk County, serving groups from Port Dover, Simcoe and Waterford.

Our mission

Scouting's Mission is achieved by:

- involving youth throughout their formative years in a non-formal educational process.
- using a specific method that makes each individual the principal agent in his or her development as a self-reliant, supportive, responsible and committed person.
- assisting youth to establish a value system based upon spiritual, social and personal principles as expressed in the Promise and Law.

Scouting is based on three broad principles which represent its fundamental beliefs. These include:

Principles

- **Duty to God:** Defined as, Adherence to spiritual principles, loyalty to the religion that expresses them and acceptance of the duties resulting therefrom.
- **Duty to Others:** Defined as, Loyalty to one's country in harmony with the promotion of local, national and international peace, understanding and cooperation, and Participation in the development of society, with recognition and respect for the dignity of one's fellow-being and for the integrity of the natural world.
- **Duty to Self:** Defined as, Responsibility for the development of oneself. This is in harmony with the educational purpose of the Scout Movement whose aim is to assist young people in the full development of their potentials.

Practices and Methods:

We define Scouting Practices as a system of progressive self-education including:

- a promise and law,
- learning by doing,
- membership in small groups,
- progressive and stimulating programs,
- commitment to the values of doing one's best, contributing to the community, respecting and caring for others, contributing as a family member,
- use of outdoor activities as a key learning resource.

2009-2010 Registration Process

Ever wonder what's involved in the registration process? Have you heard someone say "Phase 1, Phase 2 or Phase 3?" Here's a brief overview of the three stages of the registration process at the start of each Scouting Season.

the start of each Scouting Season.

Phase 1: Group Registrars attend a Registration Information night to receive their Group's registration package. This package includes important information regarding registration as well as the pre-printed registration forms for returning members.

When does this take place? Typically the 2nd or 3rd week of August.

Phase 2: This is the period of time when each Group holds their own registration nights, has their members' forms filled out, and the group collects payment from families/individuals. This is also a great opportunity for groups to have parents sign up to help out during the year. The Group Registrar then takes the registration forms, and enters each member's information on the Scouts Canada Membership Management System (MMS) The Group Registrar activates all youth and returning Adults, and makes any new adult members Prospective Members.

When does this take place? Between Phase 1 & Phase 3 (usually late August until early to mid-October)

Phase 3: At this time, the Council Field Executive collects all of the Groups' registration forms, screening information and payment. A specific evening may be set aside where the Group Registrar will meet with the Council Field Executive or appointments may be made depending on the Area. This meeting lasts 30-60 minutes depending on the size of the group.

When does this take place? Typically between the 1st and 3rd week in October, prior to the pre-arranged deadline.

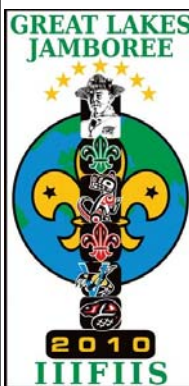
Disability Awareness Workshops Disability Awareness Badge Requirements

The name "Battlefields" was chosen because it provided for a common link throughout the area that was easily identifiable. Every Area within the Council can trace connections to the War of 1812, during which time British and Canadian troops defended the colony against American attacks.

The blue border of the crest represents the four water boundaries of the council. The interior outline of the crest is designed to represent the walls of a fort typical of the War of 1812.

The cannon represents the region's focal point during the War of 1812, when our Canadian forefathers defended our emerging nation.

The maple leaf and fleur-de-lis represents Battlefields Council's membership within Scouts Canada.

The three trilliums are an obvious link to the provincial flower of Ontario, and which is native to the area. They also represent the original three sections of Scouting in Canada: Wolf Cubs, Scouts and Rovers; the three principles of Scouting: duty to God, duty to others and duty to self; and symbolize the three Scouting areas that first came together to form Battlefields Council: Brant, Hamilton-Wentworth and Niagara.

The green background depicts the Niagara Escarpment that traverses the length of the Council. The sun rising over the Escarpment demonstrates the bright future that Scouting holds for its members.
