### Jobs That Need to Be Done:

- Trimming and cutting of trees.
- Removal of cut wood to stack along back laneway
- Raise and reset paving stones in the front walk of Wheeler Lodge & Pool House
- Repair and replace siding on outside privacy walls at pool house change rooms.
- Clean small washrooms at pool house.
- Repair doors on Chapel so they hang properly and can be latched.
- Paint walls of one bedroom and bathroom and floors in both bedrooms of Kin Centre.
- Pressure wash decks, picnic tables, Campfire Circle and Chapel benches and apply a coat of water seal.
- Clean Kin Centre Shelves, fridges, stove, under sink cupboard doors and counters.
- Clean Kuffufle sinks, counters, storage under sink, fridges, stove & overhead range hood. (requires removal of exhaust fan)
- Replace roof on Pool House and Rangers House. (okay, we are dreaming here, but if you know anyone..)
- Build benches for sitting throughout the camp. (believe it or not, this is one of the most requested things at Scout Camps!!)

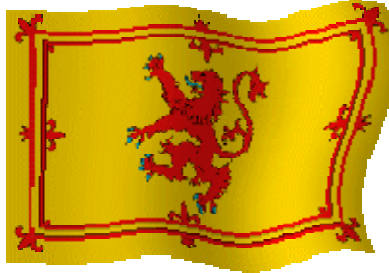

Welcome to the 7th Great Lakes Jamboree, the longest continuous running Jambo in Ontario. On behalf of the staff I would like to extend an invitation to all Scouts, Scouters, Guides and Guiders within the World Brotherhood of Scouting and Guiding to attend and be part of this wonderful Jamboree experience. The dates for this Jamboree of Fun and Action Packed Adventure are July 8 – 16, 2006. Jambo 7 has moved to Camp BEL at Dorchester near London Ontario!! This new location has allowed us to make changes to the existing program while keeping all of the best of the old program. In keeping with our desire to always have something new to offer, and since we are approaching the 100th anniversary of the Brownsea camp, we have added a whole new village: “Back to Brownsea – the Adventure Continues”.

Another new village is the Engineering Challenge Village.

We will have 7 main area villages for day programming plus the overnight Brownsea challenge and a full 5 nights of Subcamp program with 2 nights of camp wide program. There are canoe trips, repel towers, climbing wall, archery, rifle ranges, blacksmith forge, 2 levels of hikes and much more. Special Opening and Closing ceremonies will add to your Jamboree Adventure.

More exciting news is that all new out trip locations have been discovered for this Jamboree. Each Troop will have 1 main out trip and 1 other if desired at no additional cost. Last Jamboree we succeeded in getting the Youth Indaba up and running and will expand it based on need and Youth feedback for this Jamboree.

Cost for the Jamboree is \$185 / person plus your troop registration fee. This includes everything except your food and how you get to the site and home again. We are always looking to maintain the price as low as possible while providing the best activities and experience for your Troop. As a team, we feel this is still the best deal anywhere for your youth in the summer of 2006.
